How about 1946 when girls wore skirts just a shade above the knees, sweaters two or three sizes too big, saddle shoes or brown loafers, and single strands of pearls.

Twenty years ago, boys just weren't "with it" unless they were seen in V-neck sweaters, pin-striped shirts, black suede shoes, and suede belts.

By 1956 the girls were wearing longer skirts and bobbie socks (which were rolled down as far as possible). Buckles on the backs of shoes were popular. If the buckles were left open it meant you were open for dates and if they were closed, you were going steady.

Coming with the year '57 were roaring-twenty sweaters and shorter hair-cuts for girls. Sideburns were out for guys as crew cuts and flat tops became popular.
